**Twoslidin Performance Horses** is owned and operated by Jennifer and Troy Murrell. Jennifer and Troy both got their horse showing career started in 4-H, Jennifer in her hometown of Jewell, IA and Troy in his hometown of Linneus, MO. Jennifer continued showing horses throughout her college years at William Woods University, in Fulton, MO. Upon graduating in May of 1999 she started work as assistant trainer for Randy Cutbirth in Willard, MO. Troy also continued showing horses as he attended Truman State University in Kirksville, MO. While at Kirksville Troy competed on the Intercollegiate Show Horse Association team and was reserve champion in the Intermediate Horsemanship class at nationals his senior year. Troy began working for Randy in Dec. 1997.

Both Jennifer and Troy owe their success in the reining arena to the late Randy Cutbirth. As they worked with/for Randy learning to train reining horses, they also learned from his amazing ability to teach people to ride their reining horses. Randy was an amazing horseman and teacher and his influence has shaped Jennifer and Troy's training and business philosophy. Jennifer and Troy continued working for Randy until his untimely death in May 2005.

Jennifer is the main operator of Twoslidin Performance Horses which she operates out of the Flyin' M Arena, 8802 State Hwy M Mt.

Vernon, MO. She has been on her own with Troy's support since April of 2007. Jennifer accepts horses for training, clients for lessons and enjoys giving reining clinics. Jennifer's latest accomplishments include showing Antonina SF to the Limited Reined Cow Horse Championship at Scottsdale 2011 show. Jennifer also has titles Reining at Scottsdale and US Nationals as well as in the ApHC and the NRHA.

Troy spends the majority of his time managing Singinghearts Farm in Rogersville, MO owned by Sharon and Walt Davis. Troy started working at Singinghearts Farm in April of 2007 as the breeding manager and is now the farm manager/trainer. Troy has had success at Singinghearts Farm earning the Limited Open Reserve Championship and Open top ten at the Scottsdale Reining Futurity in 2010 on Aalexsei SF. Troy has also multiple top ten awards in Scottsdale in sport horse classes. Troy has also received championships and reserve championships showing Singinghearts Farm horses in western pleasure, hunter pleasure, reining and sport horse classes while showing in regions 8, 9 & 11. He has also had a successful show season show western pleasure aboard Psoulfire, 2006 bay stallion owned by Duke and Debbie Jones.

Jennifer will be showing at the U.S. National in Reined Cow Horse and Reining. Troy will be

show at US National in Reining. Jennifer will be riding Aantonina SF and Troy will be riding Aalexsei SF both are bred and owned by Singinghearts Farm.

Spirit of Pine has sired multiple NRHA money earners as well as get earning world titles in the ApHC, ABHA, AQHA and NRHA.

### **Pinewood Arabians**

Tucked away in Mansfield, a tiny town in the Ozarks of southwest Missouri, is an exciting young bay Arabian stallion with a pedigree filled with champions going back for generations. His name is Psoulfire and he is proudly owned by Duke and Debbie Jones of Pinewood Arabians. Sired by Padrone Psyche and out of a champion daughter of Afire Bey V, Psoulfire is indeed a genetic giant. Psoulfire has become the main focus of the Pinewood program and he is generating a lot of excitement in the breeding barn and the show arena.

Duke stumbled upon Psoulfire several years ago while looking at a Versace daughter at an Arabian farm near St. Louis. The young stallion was in an inconspicuous rear stall, basically out of view, but Duke was immediately drawn to him. They subsequently purchased the Versace daughter with the condition that they could obtain a breeding to the young stallion. When it was time to breed the Versace mare, the owners suggested Psoulfire be leased and taken to Mansfield to be bred there. Duke and Debbie agreed, but with some trepidation as they had never previously owned or handled a stallion. Once Psoulfire arrived, he was quite raucous and actually scary, quickly earning the nickname "Freddy" after the character Freddy Krueger of the Nightmare on Elm Street movies. The name stuck, but thankfully the personality did not. After only a short time, with loving care and special treatment he became mellow, docile and easy to handle. Freddy really responded to all this love and attention and he appeared to be begging to stay. In an easy and fortuitous decision, Duke and Debbie decided they simply could not let him go and negotiated his purchase.

Freddy was bred to three lovely Pinewood mares and produced three outstanding fillies.

Tragically, the Versace daughter and her wonderful filly were both lost due to complications of a terribly difficult delivery. The other two fillies are equally gorgeous and are getting even more beautiful every day. One has been sold to Virginia, and the other is being retained as a future show filly and broodmare. Another Psoulfire foal is expected at Pinewood in 2012, a full sibling to the filly being retained. Two other local breeders, Jennifer Hurt and Barbara Quackenbush, each have plans to breed one of their mares to Psoulfire in 2012 as well. Additionally, Psoulfire's Sport Horse Nationals Payback breeding was one of the first sold when the 2012 breedings became available in September, and was purchased by an astute Arabian breeder in Texas.

Hidden in the Ozarks are some really great breeding farms and JRs Gentle Hills is one of them!

Educating ourselves over the years by consulting Judges, Vets, Trainers, and fellow Arabian Horse owners, we now have the stock that believe will meet our goals of producing nice classical old world looking Arabians who can perform, perform, perform!!!

Starting with our stallion, we just knew we had to have him the moment we saw him and purchased him when he was just two months old. His sire was TC MR Lucky, one of the last \*Naborr sons bred by Tom Chauncey, making this stallion the youngest \*Naborr grandson alive. He turned three years old this past August and he will be making his first show appearance this November at the Ozark Heartland Arabian Classic Show in SHIH and in Halter. What we like most about this stallion is that he carries the type & look of the classic old world Arabian and we're confident that he will turn heads at the show.

The plans for this incredible stallion is western pleasure. However, we eventually want to move into reining, cutting and working cow and therefore looked for mares that we thought would complete our goal.

When we heard that Pure Polish Racing Farm Five Mile Ranch of Joplin, MO was auctioning all of their estate including the horses, we made sure to go.

We purchased the 18 year old mare FMR Sundance, a \*Krezus,

\*Genua & \*Orzel granddaughter, who's maternal sister was FMR Hassaddah, the 1994 Horse of the Year who earned over \$167,000 before her exportation, who was sired by a \*Naborr grandson. We are hoping that with the cross of this mare with our \*Naborr grandson will produce the same athletic horse who will win high earnings in reining or cutting as FMR Sundance shows a lot of natural skill for reining and cutting. Because we aren't standing our stallion until 2012, we bred Sundance to Synergy NA, sired by Metropolis NA and out of Silkwood in hopes of a filly.

We also were able to purchase former racing mare FMR Dunasia, sired by \*Dunajec and out of an \*Orzel daughter. \*Dunajec being the leading racing sire from 1967 to 1974. Although she's 23 years old and didn't conceive this year, we are hoping that next year we can get a foal from her by our stallion. However, if we are unable to do so, we will still be able to carry her sire's bloodlines thru this mare's son, FMR Speedi Jose. "The old grey mare isn't what she used to be" but she still has a lot of go left in her. She's a real smooth ride and still remembers her racing days even out on the trail as she will cut off a horse trying to pass her, especially if they try to pass on the inside.

FMR Speedi Jose is a 5 year old bay gorgeous stallion who we sold to a lady in Fair Grove, MO but did retain future breedings.

We welcome all visitors and we are an AHA Discovery Farm.
